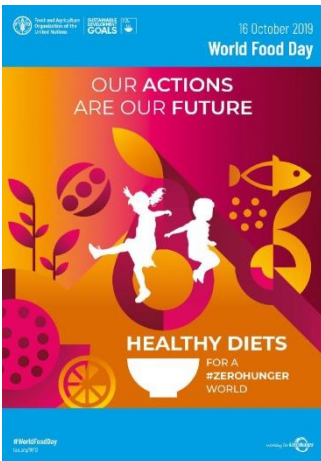


ESCO SA - WHO ARE WE?

Why is it important to talk about Gender Equality?

- Providing women and girls with equal access to education, health care, decent work, and representation in political and economic decision
- Implementing new legal frameworks regarding female equality in the workplace

It is essential that **both women and men** are aware of the **benefits** that **gender equality** brings to them as individuals and as members of communities and societies

We should stand for the right of every woman to **live equally** and **free from discrimination**, no matter her sexuality or identity.

What's the goal here?

To ensure access to safe water sources and sanitation for all.

Clean, accessible water for all is an essential part of the world we want to live in and there is sufficient fresh water on the planet to achieve this. However, due to bad economics or poor infrastructure, millions of people including children die every year from diseases associated with inadequate water supply, sanitation and hygiene.

More than **2 billion** people are living with the risk of reduced access to freshwater resources and by 2050

1 in 4 people is likely to live in a country affected by chronic or recurring shortages of fresh water

To improve sanitation and access to drinking water, there needs to be **increased investment** in management of **freshwater ecosystems** and **sanitation facilities** on a local level in several developing countries within Sub-Saharan Africa, Central Asia, Southern Asia, Eastern Asia and South-Eastern Asia

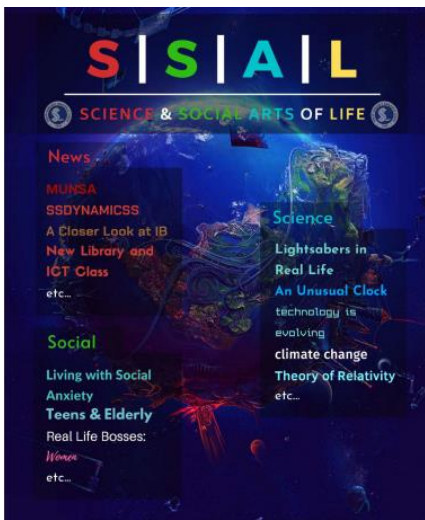
AIIESEC team conducted a Project named "Speak to Lead" with our students.
