Ludwig Wittgenstein

Out of the world’s approximately 7.8 billion inhabitants, 1.35 billion speak English. The majority aren’t native English speakers, though. About 360 million people speak English as their first language. Moreover, the language of trade, politics, science, technology, culture, history and art is English. If you are conducting an international study or doing research, whatever the subject is, most of the resources you can easily access are the ones produced in English. It is obvious that being a world citizen depends heavily on knowing English.

Sabancı English Department, in line with the vision and mission statements of the school, has the mission of training the students as world citizens with effective communication skills. To this end, our school has started to implement the IB Diploma Program in the 2020-2021 academic year and it will produce its first IBDP graduates in 2023. As a requirement of the program, our students are exposed to an intensive English program in preparatory class. We adopt the communicative approach, where the students are exposed to naturalistic target language and make use of authentic materials. We also have experienced native speaker teachers with whom students can practice English.

As well as taking part in conferences and contests, Sabancı English Department hosts local and international events. In 2020, we hosted nationwide Model United Nations Conference called MUNSA with the participation of nearly 300 students from 20 schools. This year our club works very actively and every two weeks students come together and they hold mock debates. So far, we have attended Kadir Has University and Galatasaray Lisesi MUN Conferences and many of our students have been awarded with outstanding delegate and best delegate honors. We are planning to hold our second edition of MUNSA Conference in May. Our students are planning to attend several national and international conferences as well. We have a cooperation with Boğaziçi University and Sabancı University MUN Clubs and the students are going to come together and conduct mock debates. Also, we celebrated “European Language Day” with prep students and they introduced themselves in different languages.

As well as MUN Conferences, we also participated in an international online conference named “Women Who Changed the World” with India and Peru as members of UNESCO Club. Our priorities are to organize some activities to raise awareness on special days defined by UNESCO. Our club holds monthly meetings to take action based on the predefined schedule. Furthermore, we have been running a Scrabble Club and planning to have tournaments in April at school and in the city.

At the very beginning of this term, we decided to continue our English Drama tradition, which we have been maintaining since the 2000s, after the two-year pandemic. As the English Drama Club, we have set out to stage the play “The Tragicomedy of Julia Caesar”, which questions gender equality, political power and hypocrisy with a group of enthusiastic 'Prep' students. As every year, we hope and plan to meet with our audience within the scope of 19 May Atatürk Commemoration and Youth Week.

As an English Department, we have been conducting various e-Twinning projects through which the students have the chance to communicate with international students. Together with our 8 partners from various countries, we started the "Heal the World" project. This project aims to increase and develop our awareness about the need to be more responsible from an environmental point of view. This year, we hope to have a good time with the meetings, competitions and events we will organize with our partners and to turn our world into a more livable place. In addition, the “Old But Gold” project focuses on The Canterbury Tales by Geoffrey Chaucer. It is an old but gold work of English literature. Seven tales are chosen and studied in a fun and creative way. It is expected to make a connection between the past and the present by drawing conclusions from the tales. Furthermore, “Poetry Together” will be a project about learning some important American and English poets and their most important works. In this project, we will not only explore important poets and their works, but also learn how to translate poems to other languages and even write poems in English. We will also translate famous poems of our own countries into English and get to know more about our partners’ culture.

Furthermore, we have set up a school partnership with Gribskov Gymnasium from Denmark. We are going to exchange students and teachers next semester. We were also awarded with 2 Bronze and 1 Gold Medals at the symposium organized by the Malaysian Ministry of Education. We will try to improve new school partnerships with various schools in foreign countries to develop intercultural relations. To conclude, our department policy is to train individuals who are aware of social and universal problems and respectful to human rights and different cultures and who are well equipped with English language and can communicate fluently in English.

HOW ANTS RULE THE WORLD

Ants are small creatures that most of the time are not even remarkable enough to be the center of attention. Despite their extremely harmless and simple appearance, ants have a whole world, society and behavior of their own.

ANTS? ANTS.

One of the factors that makes ants insignificant for us is that they are everywhere at all times. In fact, their omnipresence is not an illusion, ants are indeed scattered throughout the world. Argentine ants, particularly, have spread all over the world except Antarctica with their global everlasting invasion. The fact that ants are so common also makes us humans recognize them. “There is a word for ‘ants’ in nearly all languages,” says Philip Ward. “It’s a universal idea. That’s not true for many insects.”

It is true that the world has not always been an ant’s world. Studies have shown that modern-day ants first evolved around 120 million years ago. Nevertheless, they are still valuable in terms of ecological importance. Ants turn and aerate the soil, which allows water and oxygen to reach plant roots. They are also a part of seed dispersal and providing food for many different organisms.

VICTORY AT ALL COSTS

It is clear that ants are everywhere. What lies behind this success is their determination and dedication. *Forelius pusillus* ants have a unique way to avoid their enemies. Every night, *Forelius pusillus* ants protect the colony by sealing off the entrance of their nest with sand. In order for the colony to do this, some ants work from the outside, completing the job. However, they die by the next morning, unable to re-enter once the entrance is closed. According to Science magazine, they are “the first known example of a suicidal defense that is preemptive rather than a response to immediate danger.”

“The eccentric world of ants may put the biology world and humans’ behaviour in perspective.”



LIVING ARCHITECTURE

On the other hand, ants do not settle in one place and stay there forever. Some ants walk through the woods every night, looking for a new place. During this journey, they solve the obstacles they encounter in their own way: building living architecture. If there is a gap on the way, ants make a bridge from themselves and pass through it. “There is no leader, no architect ant saying ‘We need to build here,’” says Simon Garnier, in a study focused on when an army ant colony decides to build a bridge.

Moreover, ants are pretty advanced at using their bodies to build towers and even nests, as well. Both army ants and fire ants build temporary nests called bivouacs which are made from hundreds of the ants themselves in order “to protect and raise their young.

HOW TO SPEAK ANT

From suicide for the survival of other ants to building architecture as a group, ants show that they are social insects. Their communication is mainly based on teamwork. At the same time, they have quite a bit of different ways to communicate. Rubbing their antennae together, through sound, but for the most part ants communicate with odorous chemical substances called pheromones. These chemical particles can have many functions within a species which is mainly a part of regulation of social behaviours.

It can be seen when the old queen releases pheromones that cause workers to feed certain larvae in order to produce a new queen who will take over when the old queen dies.

Ants seem to be complicated creatures with many skills, which is impressive for an insect with an undemanding look. And maybe they can bring the world to its knees with their numbers, self-discipline and social cohesion.

NUCLEAR ENERGY: REMNANT OF THE PAST OR THE FUTURE OF ENERGY?

Nuclear energy makes 10% of the world's energy production. It is one of the best alternatives for fossil fuels. While it can save the Earth, an accident at a power plant can kill countless people. So, is it worth taking the risk?



There are several benefits of nuclear energy. First of all, it saves lives. According to NASA, nuclear power has prevented around 1,8 million deaths. By reducing the usage of fossil fuels, countless cases of cancer has been avoided. Secondly, nuclear energy is way less harmful to the environment in terms of climate change. The largest contribution the climate change is caused by fossil fuels. They may be cheaper than nuclear energy but they produce CO₂ and other types of harmful gases. Storing nuclear waste underground is a bad idea but releasing chemicals into the atmosphere is even worse. This means that we can save the Earth by switching to nuclear energy.

Nonetheless, nuclear energy has its own downsides. In particular, nuclear waste and pollution are both highly poisonous and radioactive. Only after thousands of years the waste can become harmless. Nuclear waste is buried underground but scientists still do not know a place where it can be safely contained for thousands of years. What is more, nuclear power plants can be dangerous. Over sixty years of nuclear power usage, there have been seven major accidents. Four of them released significant amounts of radioactivity into the environment. The number of direct fatalities were around one thousand, while indirect kills by radioactivity are much higher. Plus, since the areas were contaminated, they were rendered unfit for human habitation. As a result, nuclear energy is dangerous if it is not properly being taken care of.



All things considered, nuclear energy can be used until we have a better way to produce energy. Also developing technology may solve the problems of nuclear waste and dangerous power plants. Therefore, it would be the best if we did more research before building nuclear power plants.

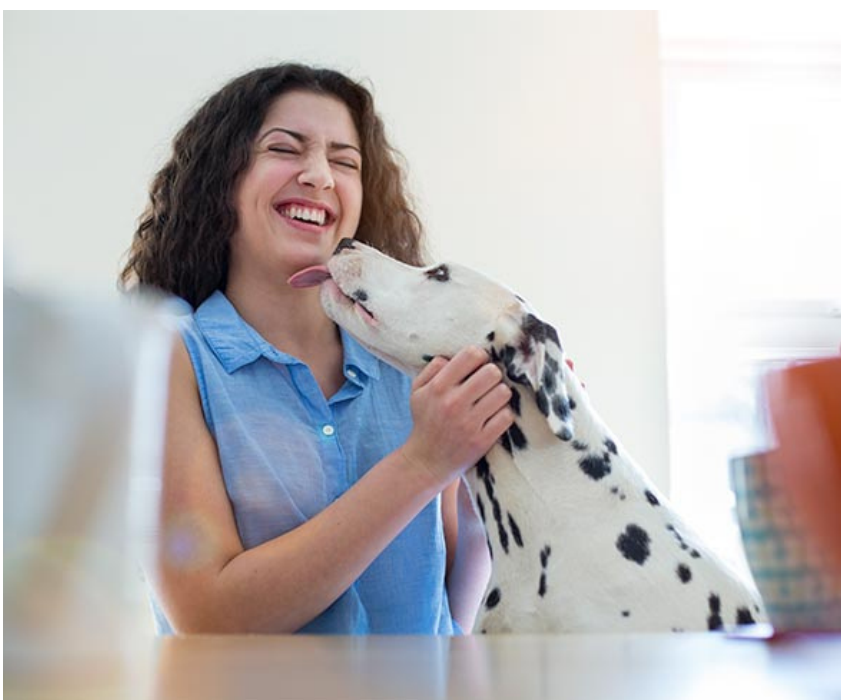
UNCONDITIONAL LOVE, DEVOTED COMPANIONSHIP, CONSTANT ENTERTAINMENT

Having or raising pets has benefits and difficulties. In my opinion, the advantages outweigh the disadvantages. Having a pet is like having a child – you need to take care of another life. Although it is a big responsibility, living with them and caring for them can also be a great experience, very entertaining and give unconditional love. As I explain below in detail, pets have psychological, medical and social support to their owners.



First of all, pets make us feel less alone. They can be there for you even when people can not. They offer emotional support and constant cuddles that help stave off social isolation. A national survey of pet owners and non-pet owners by the Human Animal Bond Research Institute found that 85 percent of respondents believe that interaction with pets reduces loneliness.



Secondly, pets make us happier. Playing and spending time with them releases serotonin and dopamine hormones in the brain. These hormones help us relax and calm down. A 2009 study in Japan found that staring into your dog's eyes raises your level of oxytocin, also known as the "love hormone." This hormone response is triggered whenever we feel a sense of social bonding, connection and attachment. Besides the general health benefits of owning a dog, they are natural mood boosters. Those with AIDS are less likely to suffer from depression if they own a pet according to a 2017 study. In another study, researchers asked individuals to rate people in photographs and found that people looked happier and more relaxed when they appeared with a dog.

Owning a pet can help you live longer. Modern life is stressful and high levels of anxiety can lead to numerous health problems. Luckily, pets can really help us relax – stroking your cat or simply watching fish swim around in a tank can make your worries melt away. Previous studies have proven that pet owners tend to have lower blood pressure, cholesterol and triglyceride levels than people who do not own a pet. That means having a furry pal can decrease the chances of suffering a heart attack later in life. Pets can also improve your immune system. As they spend a lot of their time outside and therefore bring all sorts of dirt and germs into your home. The additional germs can help improve your immunity to colds and other mild illnesses.



Dogs help us meet new people, make friends and make us more social. Having a dog can be immensely helpful when you're looking to make new friends, date or just get to know more people in your community. A study found that young people (age 18 to 26) with strong bonds with their pets also reported higher levels of connection and satisfaction with their community and relationships.



When you own a pet, you feel more responsibility. Because if you have a pet you have to manage your time better to make extra time for your pet. Pets can also teach children compassion and responsibility when a child cares for a pet. A child can learn how to educate it and love another creature. Additionally, there are many proven ways pets have a positive impact on children. A study indicates that attachment to pets, including dogs, can help children regulate their emotions. The survey also found that having a pet as a young teen and young adult was correlated with a greater sense of empathy and confidence in those individuals.

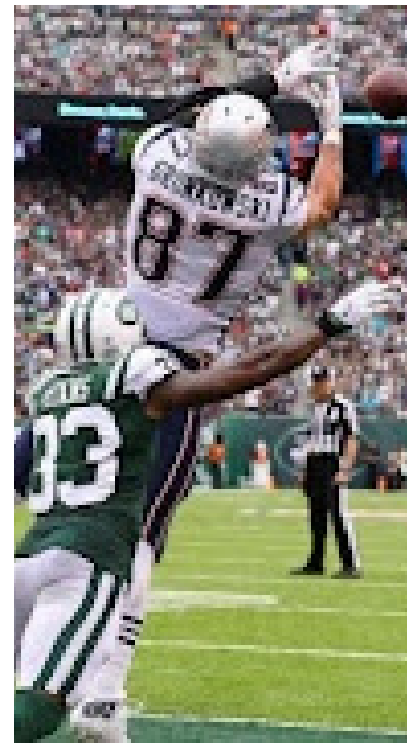


A SMALL INTRODUCTION TO AMERICAN FOOTBALL

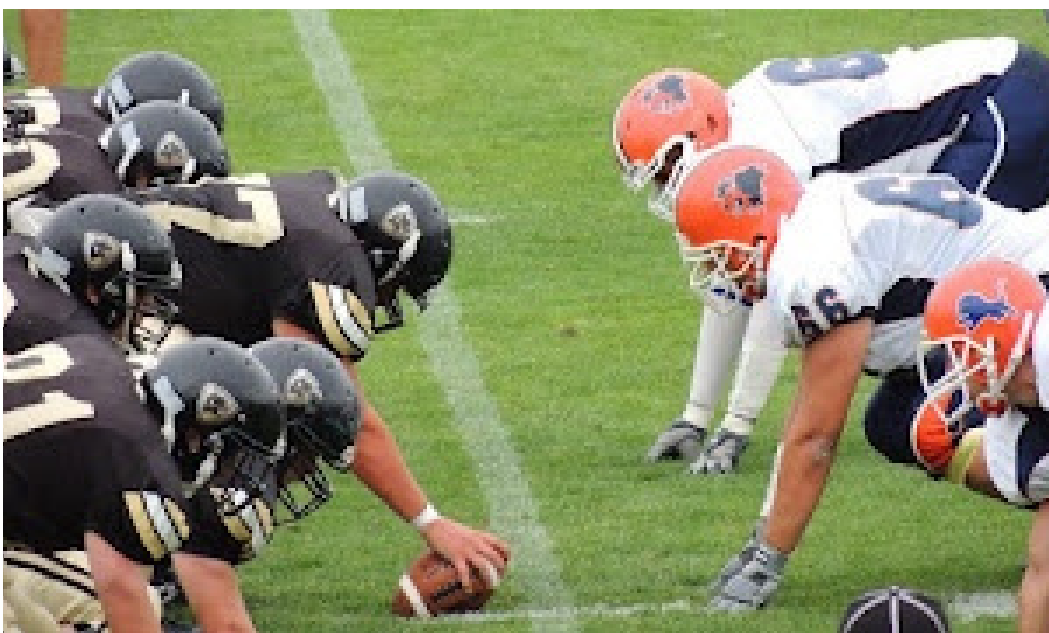

The E-Sports industry has gained a serious amount of followers and attention in the last 15 years or so. So much that it is funded and supported by companies and investors all around the globe. If we were to take a look at the games that were at the top in the industry, almost for a decade at that, they all require some sort of strategy or plan-making skills to be successful at. This enhances the feeling of competition and makes games more popular. There are mainly a couple of games that are played consistently and competed upon regularly. Those are:

For instance, the game "League of Legends" has a huge fan base and has had its own e-sports tournaments for almost a decade! They organize World Championships almost every year which gains a lot of popularity and attention. The 2021 League of Legends Worlds Championship was one of the biggest esports organizations in 2021. It was the crowning event of League of Legends esports for the year. Worlds 2021 was the tournament for the MOBA (multiplayer online battle arena) video game League of Legends. It was the 11th world championship. The tournament was organized by the game's developer, Riot Games. The tournament was planned to be held in China but due to the changing Covid-19 situation and epidemic control policies in China event has been moved to Reykjavík, Iceland. The tournament started on 5 October and finished on 6 November. The tournament welcomes 24 teams from all regions of the game. 4 teams from China, 4 teams from Korea, 3 teams from, Europe, 3 teams from North America, 2 teams from PCS (Taiwan, Hong Kong, Macao, and Southeast Asia) 1 team from Brazil, 1 team from CIS (Commonwealth of Independent States), 1 team from Japan, 1 team from Latin America, 1 team from Oceania and 1 team from Turkey. Galatasaray represented our country in Worlds 2021. The prize pool for this tournament was USD 2,225,000. The champion has won \$489,500. 2nd team has won \$333,750, 3rd and 4th teams \$178,000, and 5th-8th teams \$100,125. Every year Riot Games introduce a new theme song for the tournament. This year "Burn It All Down" was the tournament's theme song.

NINTENDO'S PLACE IN ESPORTS

In order to talk about Nintendo's place in esports, we should talk about their philosophy first. Nintendo is a company that makes games 'accessible' and 'fun to play' for everyone. They're more of a 'family friendly' company which means acknowledging and supporting the esports scene behind one of their games can be seen as a direct counter to their mindset. But that doesn't mean Nintendo always disliked esports. They're among the first on the scene to support esports with their Nintendo World Championships in 1990 and Nintendo Powerfest in 1994. But after that, Nintendo just stepped back from esports for a long time. The company always had an on and off relationship with esports thanks to Super Smash Bros series. They mostly stayed uninvolved and never directly engaged with esports again until 2014 with the Super Smash Bros Invitational and a

Splatoon Tournament in Japan with over million dollars prize. But mostly, they acted like they hated esports. They prohibited Major League Gaming from livestreaming matches of Super Smash Bros. Brawl. in 2010, cancelled The Big House SSB tournament because the tournament required the usage of Slippi, which Nintendo claimed was illegal. In NA Open Splatoon event, some teams protested Nintendo by changing their names to support the #SaveMelee movement so Nintendo decided not to livestream this event either. Looking to the past, Nintendo had a rough time with esports. But what about the future? Can Pokémon UNITE become as popular in esports? Pokémon UNITE is a new MOBA-like Pokémon game with cross-play on Switch and mobile. It's described as 'An intense MOBA with a friendly skin.' Of course, it has its problems but none of them are too big to be in the way. Let's look at the gameplay first. As someone who has played the game for a long amount of time, I can say that its quite enjoyable as expected. It also offers plenty of space for out-playing opponents on your skill. You need to dodge, use items and special abilities in the correct time in order to win, just like other MOBA's.



There is also a feature called 'Fair play points' which reward good player behaviours and ban griefing players. It also has its downs such as the 'lack of creeps'. You can't also see game replays which is normally essential. The game is also a 'Free-to-start' game which means you must pay real-life money in order to have some potential shortcuts or unlocking more characters and levelling up faster etc. Which might be a barrier for new players. But these downsides could be fixed with simple adjustments and updates.



LATEST MACBOOK PRO

We know that Apple is one of the most famous technology brands in the world. Apple presents the newest technology gadgets every single year. We can see Apple devices mostly from people who deal with business. Because they are designed for work not for gaming, 20 million Mac and MacBook units were sold in 2020. This is the statistics of 2020. Since the year 2021 hasn't finished, we don't have the statistics yet. The strongest version of MacBook Pro 2021 includes an Apple M1 Max chip with 8 performance cores with 2 efficiency cores CPU, 32 cores GPU, 16 core Neural Engine and 400GB/s. Actually these features are the best among business laptops. Of course we can not compare them with gaming laptops, they are much stronger.

What are the other technologies MacBook Pro with m1 max offers? It provides you with one of the best screens on the market. The Liquid Retina XDR display on the 16-inch model of the MacBook M1 Pro measures 16.2 inches. The 16-inch display features 3456×2234 resolution at 254 PPI.

The 14-inch MacBook M1 Pro is powered by a 70Wh lithium-polymer battery that Apple claims will last up to 17 hours of Apple TV app movie viewing and 11 hours of wireless web browsing. The 96W USB-C power adapter that comes with the MacBook M1 Pro supports fast charging as well.

A 100Wh lithium-polymer battery powers the 16-inch MacBook M1 Pro and can last up to 21 hours of Apple TV viewing and 14 hours of wireless web browsing. The supplied 140W USB-C power converter supports fast charging once more. The Nvidia GeForce RTX 3090 still rules the roost, even despite AMD's efforts to topple it. VIRTUAL REALITY

VR is an acronym that is used for “Virtual Reality”. Virtual Reality is an experience simulated by a computer. Users of the VR technology use special tech equipment such as VR headsets, motion platforms, controller gloves and controller guns to make them feel like they are in that computer-simulated world. The users seeing, hearing, touching and walking in the computer-simulated world makes that experience quite realistic.



VR'S PROGRESSION

The origins of VR technology dates back to the mid-1950s. The first things that could be considered as a Virtual Reality device was called “Sensorama”. Sensorama was a VR device that played 3D films with extra realistic effects such as corresponding vibrations, head movements, sounds and rushes of wind. If you lived in the 1960s you could experience a ten-minute-long motorcycle ride through New York City for 25 cents with this machine. In 1968 Ivan Sutherland created the first augmented reality HMD system that was called “The Sword of Damocles”. This head-mount that was suspended from the ceiling could show simple virtual wire-frame shapes that were simulated by a computer. Thanks to it's tracking system 3D models changed perspective when the user moved their head. It was never commercialized because it was too heavy for users to comfortably wear.

Kruger's VIDEOPLACE that was developed in 1975 was the first interactive VR platform. Cameras were used to capture the users' silhouettes and the users could see their computer-generated silhouettes doing whatever movement they did on the screen. Users could interact with other users and computer-simulated objects. In 1979 McDonnell-Douglas Corporation developed the VITAL VR helmet ,that could follow pilot's eye movements, for military use In 1985 VPL Research, Inc. became the first company to sell VR goggles, gloves and a range of VR equipment. In the following years VR technology kept developing and becoming even more realistic. VR technology is now more affordable than ever and has a wider range of use than ever.

THE FUTURE OF VR

There is no reason not to believe that VR technology will keep getting more realistic ,more sophisticated and more affordable in the future. The range of its use will also widen. It will be possible to use VR in all kinds of things from vocational training to tourism. VR will become an indispensable part of our lives.

And there is this linked thing that's called “Metaverse” that can even be the future of human life but that topic has a title of it's own in our technology page. SWEET, SWEET HOME



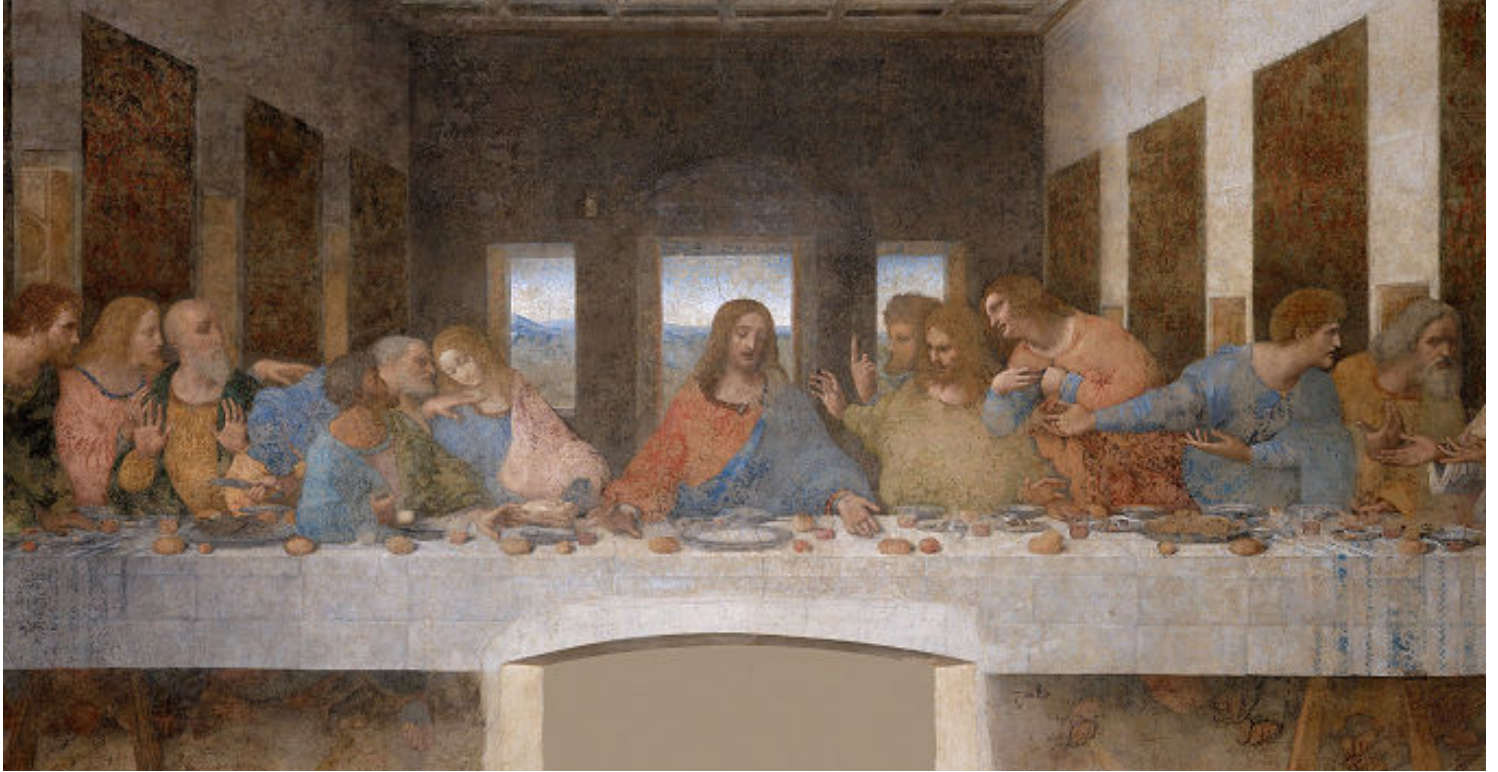

THE LAST SUPPER

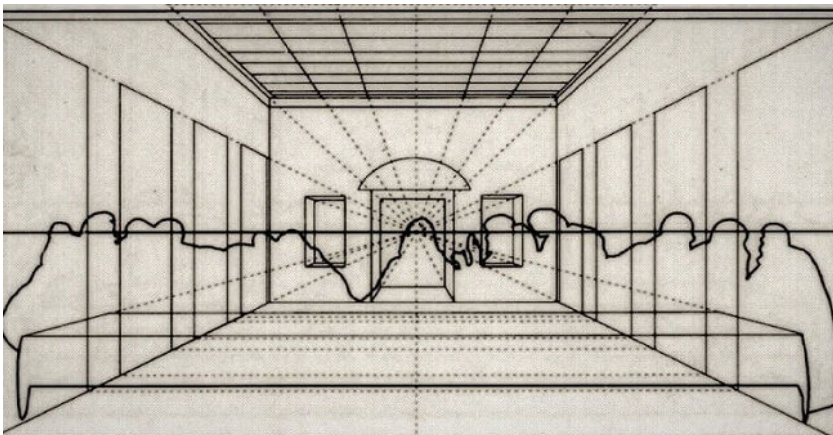
LEONARDO DA VINCI

In 1495, Leonardo da Vinci began his artwork - The Last Supper, which would become one of history's most effective works of art. Specifically, The Last Supper portrays the few seconds after Christ dropped the bombshell that one disciple would betray him before sunrise, and all twelve have given different reactions. He told them to do that (the Eucharist) in remembrance of him while referring to the bread as his body and the cup of wine as the new covenant in his blood. It was the first celebration of the Eucharist, a ritual still performed. Speculations about symbolism in the artwork are ample. For example, many scholars have discussed the meaning of the spilled salt container near Judas's elbow. It has been said to represent his betrayal, or alternatively, is seen as a sign of his bad luck in being the one chosen to betray. The fish, served has similarly conflicted explications. If it is meant to be eel, it might represent instruction and thereby faith in Jesus. However, if it's herring, then it could symbolize a nonbeliever who denies religion.

THE LAYOUT OF THE LAST SUPPER

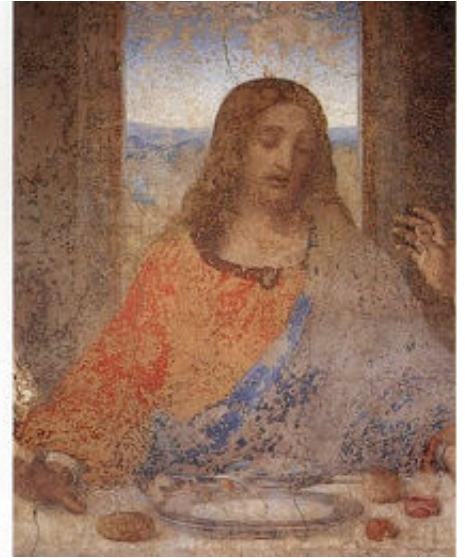


Leonardo was famous for his love of symmetry. We see a large table in the foreground with all of the figures behind it. There are equal numbers of figures on either side of Jesus and that makes the painting, largely symmetrical .

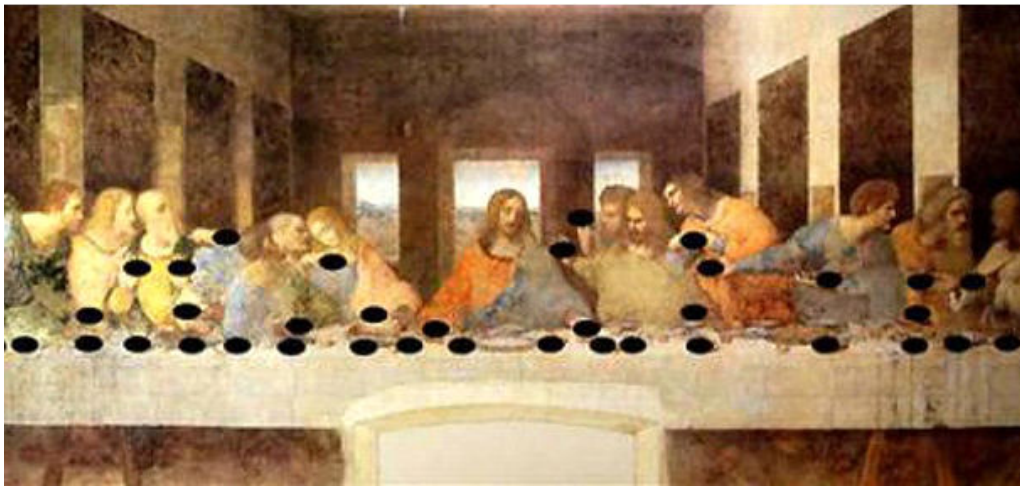
What makes the masterpiece so striking is the perspective used which seems to invite the viewer to step into the dramatic scene. To achieve this illusion, da Vinci drove a nail into the wall, then tied string to the wall, making marks that helped guide her hand as he created the angles of the painting.

THE LAST SUPPER RESTORATION BEFORE AND AFTER

Unlike traditional frescoes, which Renaissance masters painted on wet plaster walls, da Vinci invented his own technique, in order to spend all the time he needed to perfect every detail: using tempura paint on stone. So he experimented with tempura paint on a dry, sealed plaster wall in the Santa Maria delle Grazie monastery in Milan, Italy; but sadly it has not stood the test of time well. Over the years it has crumbled, been vandalized, bombed and restored. Today we are probably looking at very little of the original.



IT HAS INSPIRED SOME WILD THEORIES.



Musicians have speculated that the true hidden message in *The Last Supper* is actually an accompanying soundtrack. In 2007, 40 seconds of a gloomy song was created by Italian musician Giovanni Maria Pala who claims *The Last Supper* predicts an apocalyptic flood that will sweep the globe from March 21 to November 1, 4006; using notes supposedly encoded within da Vinci's idiosyncratic composition.

THE LAST SUPPER ALSO INSPIRED POPULAR FICTION.

A common part of the painting's mythology is the story that Leonardo da Vinci sought through the ages for the right model for his Judas. When he found him, he realized that it was the same man who had once posed for him as Jesus. Sadly, years of hard life and sin had devastated his once angelic face.

But this story is totally false. How do we know that it is false? Stories of spiritual decay manifesting physically have existed for a long time. It is likely that someone decided to use *The Last Supper* as a similar narrative in order to give its moral message a sense of historical reliability. It is also said that the look of every apostle was based on a real-life model. When it came time to pick the face for the traitorous Judas, Leonardo da Vinci searched the jails of Milan for the perfect-looking crook.

Then Vlad ordered his soldiers to nail the turbans of the envoys to their heads so they would no longer be able to take it off.
- The Boyars (princes) of Wallachia had some troubles among themselves. He invited all Boyars to a feast and then killed all of them in order to solve the problem.
- When the Turkish Sultan Mehmed II conquered Wallachia in 1462, the last place that was left was the capital Targoviste. When the Turkish forces arrived, the whole city was abandoned and the only people left in the city were the 20.000 impaled Ottoman Turk. Before leaving the city, he ordered his men to impale every Turk and to display them in the entrance of the city. The Sultan Mehmed II, couldn't believe his eyes and immediately left the city.



IDI AMIN



Idi Amin was a Ugandan soldier. In 1971, when the Ugandan president Obote was on a trip in Singapore, Idi Amin overthrew the government with a military coup and declared himself as the new president of Uganda. In 1972, he deported all the Asians in Uganda. This was the first racist step of Idi Amin. Indians had taken important parts in the administration of the country. He filled the empty positions with the Muslim minority and his relatives in the country. That is why the Muslim minority had golden era under the rule of Idi Amin. He cut off the relationship between Israel and Uganda. This was a reaction to show that Uganda sided with Palestine. As a reaction to this behaviour, UK and USA drew their ambassadors. In 1976, he declared his dictatorship. He called himself as the lifetime president of Uganda. He killed 100.000-500.000 people. In the summer of 1976, a French plane that was carrying Israeli and Jewish passengers was hijacked by some Palestinians. It decreased the legitimacy and international recognition of the Idi Amin government. However, his people were happy about the situation until the Israeli special forces came and took the all hostages back to Israel. By 1978, Idi Amin lost his power because of the revolts in the country. In 1979, rebellions arrived to the capital but before their arrival, Idi Amin had already gone to Libya.

THE GREAT EMU WAR

Have you ever heard of a country losing to birds? Your answer is probably no but in the vast world of history there is a war that just that, to be precise it's The Great Emu War. The Great Emu war was a fierce war which took place in Australia but in reality it was not even a war it was a "nuisance wildlife management military operation" which began in 1932 to understand why it happened and how they lost against a bunch of birds ? Let's dive deep into it.

WHAT IS AN EMU?

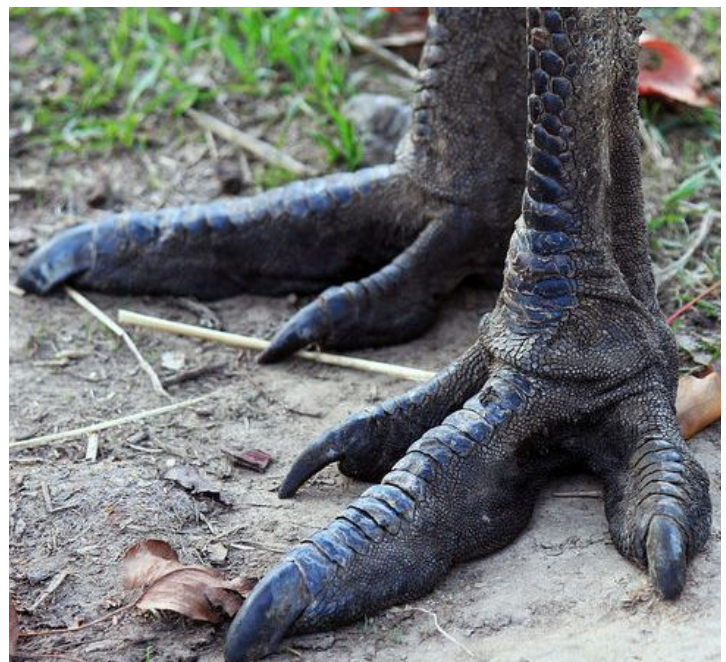


An emu is a flightless bird which is unique to Australia. Emus are soft-feathered, brown, flightless birds with long necks and legs, and can reach up to 1.9 metres (6.2 ft) in height. Emus can travel great distances, and when necessary can sprint at 50 km/h (31 mph) Emus are the fourth or fifth heaviest living bird after the two species of ostrich and two larger species of cassowary, weighing slightly more on average than an emperor penguin. Adult emus weigh between 18 and 60 kg (40 and 132 lb), with an average of 31.5 and 37 kg (69 and 82 lb) in males and females, respectively. It's the second tallest bird in the world, exceeded in height by the ostrich. They can run at 50 km/h and emus are known to have deadly claws but In most cases, emus are quite docile creatures and they do not attack humans unless provoked."EMU".

WHY DID THE WAR START?

Following World War I, large numbers of discharged veterans who served in the war were given land by the Australian government to take up farming within Western Australia, often in agriculturally marginal areas. With the onset of the Great Depression in 1929, these farmers were encouraged to increase their wheat crops, with the government promising—and failing to deliver—assistance in the form of subsidies. In spite of the recommendations and the promised subsidies, wheat prices continued to fall, and by October 1932 matters were becoming intense, with the farmers preparing to harvest the season's crop while simultaneously threatening to refuse to deliver the wheat. "Emu Wars."

Military involvement began in October 1932. The "war" was conducted under the command of Major G. P. W. Meredith of the Seventh Heavy Battery of the Royal Australian Artillery, with Meredith commanding soldiers Sergeant S. McMurray and Gunner J. O'Halloran, armed with two Lewis guns and 10,000 rounds of ammunition.



FIRST ENCOUNTER

The first battle took place in November in Campion. G. P. W. Meredith and his men spotted a mob of emus from a distance, so they opened fire. Unfortunately they were only able to kill what they called “a number” of birds but the vast majority got away because right after they opened fire the emus split up into smaller groups and ran in every direction thus making it extremely difficult to use a machine gun against them. Remember what I said about emus earlier? They are the 4th or 5th heaviest bird. This allowed them to take multiple bullets but surprisingly survive and a famous quote from G. P. W. Meredith “If we had a military division with the bullet-carrying capacity of these birds it could face any army in the world ... They can face machine guns with the invulnerability of tanks.”



SECOND ENCOUNTER

So next, they tried to ambush more than 1,000 emus near a local dam. This time the gunners waited until the birds were in close proximity before opening fire but both of the guns jammed after just 12 emus were killed. At some point Meredith even went so far as to use one of the guns on a truck, which was very ineffective for a number of reasons.

THE OUTCOME OF THE WAR

Only between 1000 and 20000 emus were killed with 10000 rounds of ammunition so in the end Australia halted the operation because it was ineffective against emus. After that the Australian government changed their strategies and used the bounty system which turned out to be effective.

Elisa had a Tumblr account that she used as a diary. Those people who investigated her case said ‘We worked on this case for hours. We started to be friends with Elisa, tried to understand what she was going through, why she had behaved this way, what was she afraid of. We saw this case as a puzzle that we could solve. That was the exciting part.’ Most people love mysterious cases. Do you? If yes, let’s start.



In 1919 LA was an explosion, they say. Everyone started to sweep there. Job opportunities, a luxurious life, city and many more... In 1924 the Cecil Hotel opened its doors. It was glorious. They spent 1 million dollar to build it. That much money was so much back then. It was quite big and had 700 rooms. Cecil was a traveler's hotel. It was in front of the Pacific Electric Light Rail Station and hundreds of people would pass from there. In the early 1930s an economic crisis happened. So the Cecil Hotel was in a bad condition. An elderly men who wanted to stay there as long as possible for a low price started to come. And some of them were bad people. There were drug dealers, prostitutes, rapists, murderers, serial killers etc. Hundreds of crimes happened there. Serial killers like Richard Ramirez alias the Night Stalker and because the Night Stalker was there an Australian serial killer Jack Unterweger stayed in the Cecil Hotel. People say, Richard Ramirez used to come to the hotel covered in blood. And nobody would say anything. The Cecil Hotel did not ask for identity. That is why, it was perfect for the people who were wanted. Hollywood star Elizabeth Short alias Black Dahlia was one the most popular homicides in America and people think that it was related to the Cecil Hotel.



But the most known and bizarre case in the Cecil Hotel is totally Elisa Lam's. Her last video before she went missing was released by the Los Angeles Police Department. They wanted help from the public and videos went viral, the public actually saw the video. They started to investigate the case, too.

Elisa was from Vancouver, Canada. She had just graduated high school. She wanted to go on a vacation before university and see the world. She would say "There is a big world and I do not even know a little of it. I should learn." She made a west coast tour plan. Her destinations were San Diego, Los Angeles, Santa Cruz, San Francisco. She came to Los Angeles on 28th January 2013 and on 1st February 2013 went missing. The Last Bookstore was the last place she had gone. She was so energetic, social and chit chatting with people. Police investigated the case, they just found her last video in the elevator and that video looked so paranormal. Pressing all the buttons, bizarre behaviors, hand moves made the video scary. People wanted so badly to find what happened to her. They saw it as a puzzle to make. After two weeks tourists started to complain about the water. It was brownish and had a terrible taste. They drank that water, had shower and brushed their teeth. That was tragic. Because Elisa Lam's body was found in the water tank of the Cecil Hotel by an employee. He said the cover of the tank was closed. And she was naked floating on the water, her clothes were at the bottom of the tank. In the autopsy they couldn't find alcohol, drugs or pills in her body. There are a lot of theories about her like homicide, suicide, elevator game, souls in the Cecil Hotel, government's game. But it persists as an unsolved mystery.



I have watched the documentary series called Crime Scene: The Vanishing At The Cecil Hotel on Netflix to learn more about the case. It has 4 episodes and each episode is approximately 50 minutes. In the docuseries, the general manager of the Cecil Hotel for ten years drew a good analogy. She said "I liken the Cecil Hotel to Titanic. At first, everybody said that this ship could not sink. It was magnificent. But we all know what happened to Titanic."
